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





# Frequently Asked Questions

1. How many graduation seals do I need to earn for graduation?
  - a. All students must earn **two seals**, one of which must be state defined, to qualify for a high school diploma.
2. Do I have to sign up for a graduation seal?
  - a. Some seals you could earn automatically if you meet the qualifications (Science, Citizenship, College Readiness, etc.) where others will require a verification process (Ohio Means Jobs, Community Service, etc.)
3. How do I let my school know if I feel that I have earned a graduation Seal?
  - a. If you have questions about a specific seal, please see your school counselor.
4. What is College Credit Plus?
  - a. Olentangy Local Schools participates in the College Credit Plus Program (CCP) where college-ready students can earn both high school and college credit at the same time. CCP requirements, required paperwork, participating college videos and CCP FAQ can all be found on the [districts CCP page](#).
5. How do I register to take the ACT or SAT?
  - a. Students can find testing dates, information and register for both the [ACT](#) and [SAT](#) on the testing organization's direct website.
6. Do I have to take ELA 2 OST if I am currently taking an AP or CCP English Class?
  - a. YES! The state requires all students to sit and take the ELA 2 OST.
7. How do I schedule a meeting with my counselor?
  - a. Students are welcome to stop down to Student Services anytime they have a free period (Late Arrival, Early Release, Lunch or Study Hall) to see their counselor. You can also email or Schoology message them to set up an appointment.
